The Department of Environmental Protection's Bureau of Petroleum Storage Systems has concluded its review of S. Bravo Systems, Inc.'s request for approval of the above referenced equipment dated July 27, 2005, and August 4, 2005, that were submitted pursuant to Rule 62-761.850, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.).

Based on the information provided by S. Bravo Systems, Inc., the Department finds that applicant's B400 Series Single Wall Sumps, B500 Series Single Wall Transition Sumps, B600 Series Single Wall Vent Transition Sumps, B9000 Series Single Wall Under Dispenser Containment Sumps, B400 Series Double Wall Tank Sumps, B500 Series Double Wall Vent Transition Sumps, B600 Series Double Wall Vent Transition Sumps, B4000 Series Double Wall Under Dispenser Containment Sumps, B8000 Series Double Wall Under Dispenser Containment Sumps, B8500 Series Double UDC & Vent Transition Combination Sumps, and the B9000 Double Wall Under Dispenser Containment Sumps will provide environmental protection substantially equivalent to that provided by compliance with the requirements established in Rules 62-761.500(1)(c), 62-761.500(1)(d), 62-761.500(6), and 62-761.500(7), F.A.C.

Pursuant to Rule 62-761.850, F.A.C., the request for the use of the above referenced products is approved as piping sumps and transition sumps for underground storage tank systems in the State of Florida.

Please be advised that the above referenced DEP rules are subject to change. If the above rule standards are modified in the future, this order may be modified or rescinded for future upgrades and installations. Additionally, if the product(s) shows a consistent pattern of failure(s), and therefore does not provide substantially equivalent environmental protection, the Department may rescind this order.

The Department's Order shall become final unless a timely petition for an administrative hearing is filed under sections 120.569 and 120.57, Florida Statutes ("F.S."), within 21 days of receipt of this Order. Persons who have filed such a petition may seek to mediate the dispute, and choosing mediation will not adversely affect the right to a hearing if mediation does not result in a settlement. The procedures for petitioning for a hearing and pursuing mediation are set forth below.
